AD: I	Philippians 4:1-3
1.	What is Paul's goal in "calling out" these two ladies?
	We don't know what the conflict was, but we know that it was serious enough to reach Paul. Paul knew the seriousness of church conflict and wanted it handled before it became unhealthy.
2.	What does this passage reveal about the value and role of women in the early church? There are a group of people who believe women didn't hold value in the early church, or even in the moder one. That couldn't be farther from the truth. Women are just as much created in the image of God as Men! I women were 2 <sup>nd</sup> class, then this conflict wouldn't have been that big of a deal.
