## Warm Up

- What makes a place feel “secure” or “homey” to you?
- Have you ever made a big decision based on location (school, job, house, church)?

Pick whatever question you enjoyed the most this week. If your group is talkative, be careful to not land here for the entire group.

## Know It

Take some time to review your sermon notes and journal your thoughts after reading the prompts below.

### Eternal Reality Check (Heaven & Hell)

Scripture teaches that eternity is real and our choices matter.

- Why do you think people are uncomfortable talking about Hell?
- What emotions come up when you think about eternity?
- How does believing in eternity shape how someone lives right now?

Our emotions often drive our decisions. That being the case, take the time to dive into why we think others don't like talking about hell, and why we don't like talking about hell. Then take the time to talk about how our lives now are in some ways shaped by our beliefs in whether hell exists. Hint: In case you missed it this week – it does... 😊

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### Assurance of Salvation — 1 John 5:13

John tells us that we can be *sure* of our salvation. We can confidently look forward to the promise of eternal life.

- Have you ever struggled with your assurance of salvation? Why?
- What is the difference between hoping you're saved and knowing?
- What role does faith in Jesus (not works) play in assurance?

A few things as you navigate this section.

1. Allow your group to openly discuss their struggles with their own salvation, but take the time to remind them that salvation is permanent. You can't lose it. Those who have called on the name of the Lord are saved! (Rom 10:13).
2. Be on the lookout for people that you might need to follow up with this week. If you have a group member who seems to think they may have it wrong about their salvation, take the time to speak to them privately afterward, or call them this week. *Remember: Mixed gender one-on-one meetings are unwise. Please call Pastor Tim if you need guidance on how to proceed.*

Be sure to talk about the difference between feelings and facts!

### The Marks of a Real Christian (1 John)

Not perfection, but direction.

John lists the following as “*marks*” or “*proofs*” of our salvation: Obedience, Repentance, Love for God over the World, Love for believers, Spiritual fruit, Prayer and Generosity. Which of these do you feel need some attention in your own life? What in this list gives your pause?

Talk about the checklist from Pastor John. Also, encourage your group. You're not going to be perfect in all of these until we are with Jesus! Use this as a launch pad for growth! Maybe your group needs a new February resolution!

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### Live It

#### “Eternity on the Mind”

- How would your behavior shift if you did things knowing that they had an impact on eternity?
- Make a mental list of your priorities, maybe work, school, family, hobbies etc. What is out of order when you consider eternity?

### Heart Check

- Which “mark of a real Christian” encouraged you?
- Which one challenged you? How are you going to respond to this challenge?

### Prayer

Take some time to collect prayer requests, but prompt your group to specifically pray for things that the Lord is moving them to change as a result of this week's study.
